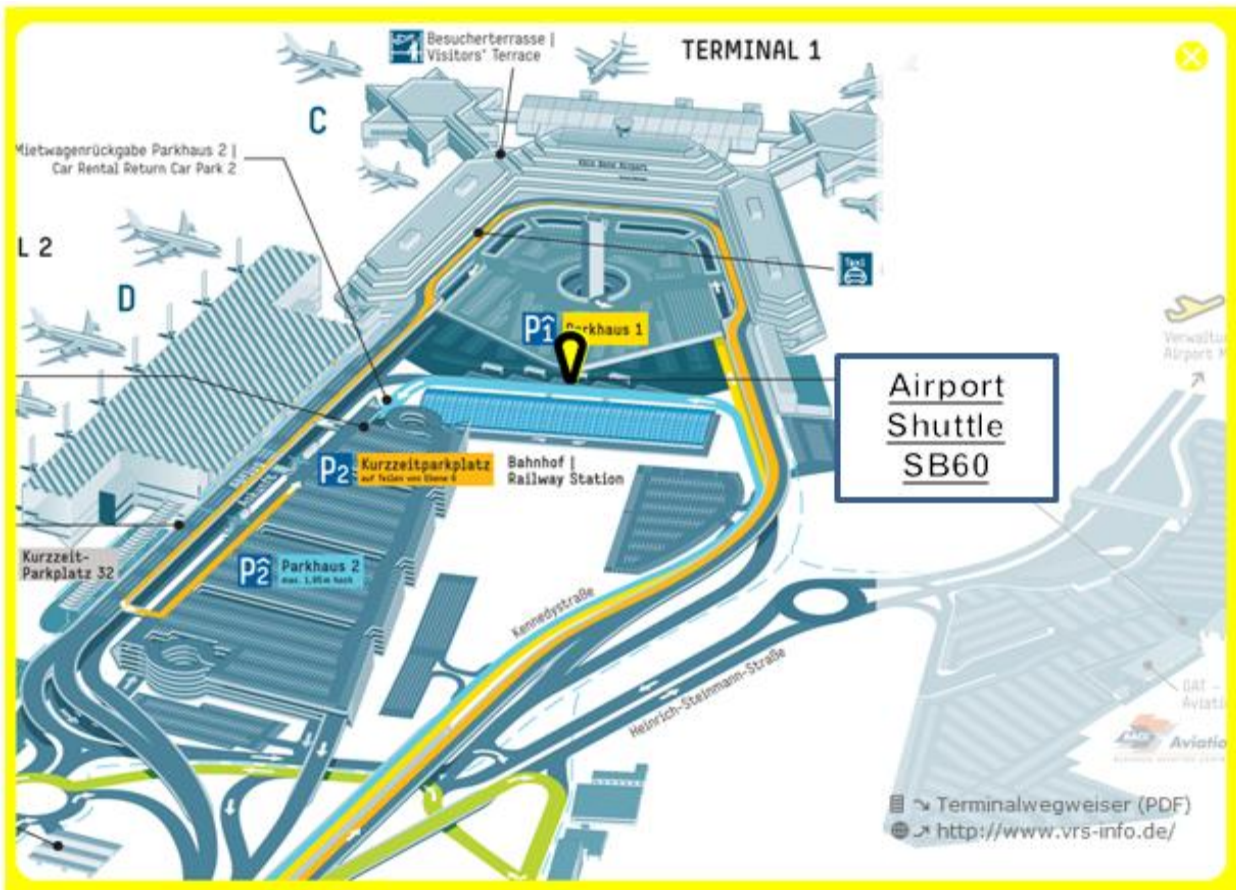

1. Getting to Bonn

Bonn is located approximately 30 km south of Cologne, and ca. 170 km northwest of Frankfurt, and can be accessed by car, by train, and by air from three airports, Cologne/Bonn Airport, Frankfurt International Airport and Düsseldorf Airport.

Participants arriving at **Cologne/Bonn Airport** can reach Bonn city center by taxi or by bus. The taxi fare from the airport to the city center is approximately €60. For travel by bus, participants would board airport shuttle SB60, departing from the bus stop at Terminal 1 to the city center (final stop "Hauptbahnhof," central station). Please see the map below for directions to the bus stop:



Participants arriving at **Frankfurt International Airport** may wish to take the train to Siegburg/Bonn. There is high-speed train service (ICE) between the airport and Siegburg/Bonn. Travel time is approximately 40 minutes. Departure is from the long-distance train station (Fernbahnhof) in the airport complex. The direction is Cologne. The stop for Bonn is the town of Siegburg (please get off at 'Siegburg/Bonn'). Taxis are available for approximately €45.00 from Siegburg to Bonn. You can also catch tram 66 from Siegburg to Bonn. The journey takes 25 minutes.

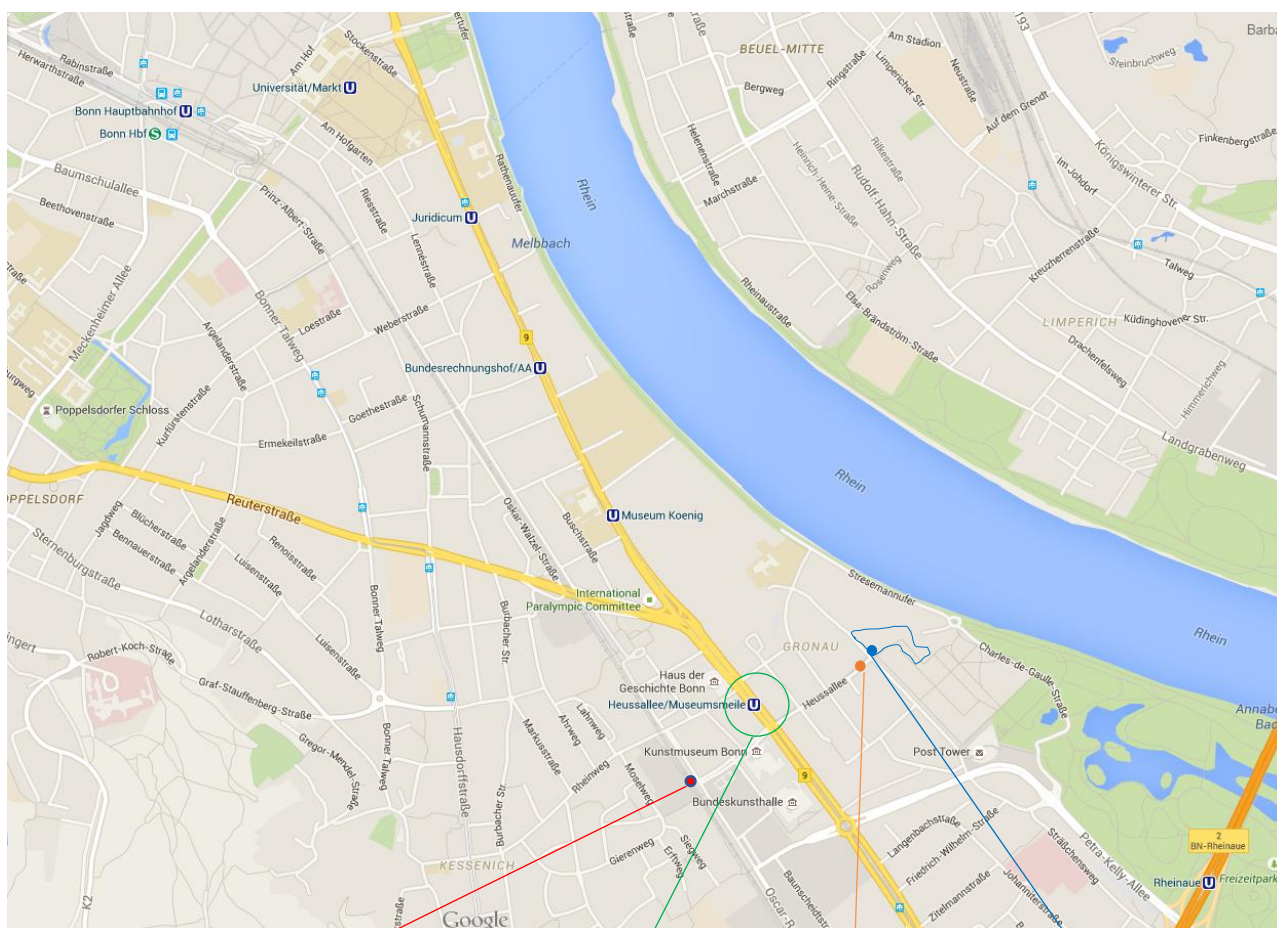
Regular train service between Frankfurt International Airport and Bonn central station (Hauptbahnhof) is also available (from the long-distance train station "Fernbahnhof" in the airport). Travel time is approximately 1 hour 45 minutes. This trip along the Rhine River is one of Germany's most scenic train trips and brings you directly into the city center of Bonn.

From **Düsseldorf Airport** to Bonn there are direct trains to the central station, which run hourly and have a travel time of about 1 hour.

The meeting will take place at the Secretariat premises on the UN Campus in Bonn. The meeting room is LE1916 at the “Langer Eugen” Building inside the UN Campus. The building offers all modern meeting facilities and equipment.

All participants must present their passports/national ID cards at the UN security guardhouse at the main entrance when they first enter the campus.

Delegates must ensure their own medical and other insurance covers for the duration of the travel, including the meeting.

How to get to the meeting venue:

> By Train – Stop “Bonn UN Campus”:

From Bonn main railway station (Hauptbahnhof) in the city centre, take either the regional train RB30 (direction: Walporzheim), RE5 (direction: Koblenz), RB 26 (direction: Mainz) or RB 48 (direction: Bonn-Mehlem, d) to the stop “Bonn UN Campus”.

From the train station Bad Godesberg take either the regional train RB26 (direction: Köln Messe/Deutz), RB30 (direction: Bonn Hbf), RB 48 (direction: Wuppertal-Oberbarmen) or RE5 (direction: Friedrichsfeld (Niederrhein)) to the stop “Bonn UN Campus”.

From the train stop, you can walk to the UN Campus, which takes around 10 minutes. It can also be reached by bus, the bus stop is “Deutsche Welle”, outside the UN.

> By tram (U-Bahn) – Stop “Heussallee/ Museumsmeile”:

From the main railway station (Hauptbahnhof) in the city centre: take tram 16 or 63 (direction Bad Godesberg) or tram 66 (direction Bad Honnef or Königswinter) to the stop “Heussallee/Museumsmeile”.

From Bad Godesberg station (Bahnhof): take tram 16 or 63 (direction: Niehl) to the stop “Heussallee/Museumsmeile”. < [Tram 16/Tram 63](#) >

Upon arrival at the stop Heussallee/Museumsmeile, exit the station by following the sign “UN Campus” and continue walking straight ahead for about 5 minutes till you see a large white building in front of a higher building being the **Langer Eugen** (UN building).

> By bus:

From Bonn city centre (Hauptbahnhof) or Bad Godesberg, take bus 610 or 611 to the stop “Deutsche Welle”. < [Bus 610](#) > < [Bus 611](#) >. The bus stop is right next to the main entrance of the UN Campus.

Tram or bus tickets can be obtained from ticket machines in the stations or in the bus or tram itself. If you are travelling in and around Bonn, press the 1b button: one-way ticket (1 trip) costs €3.80, a 24h ticket costs €9.10 and a multiple ticket (4 trips) costs €15.20.

> By taxi:

The fare for a taxi ride to the Langer Eugen from Bonn city center (Hauptbahnhof / central train station) is around €20 and from Bad Godesberg r about €25. The central phone number for Bonn taxis is +49 (0)228 555 555.

3. Security requirements at the venue

Please note the standard security requirements that you need to be familiar with when you visit us here at the UN Campus in Bonn:

- a) All participants will receive an identification badge to access the venue. You are requested to wear this badge during your stay at the UN Campus.
- b) No friends or family members are allowed to enter the UN Campus unless they are participants.
- c) Participants should not use the facilities of other offices on the conference floors.
- d) Smoking is only allowed outside the building.
- e) All participants will be checked against their passports/national ID cards.
- f) The participants are not allowed to move throughout the building unless attended by Secretariat staff.

- g) Please report any loss of conference ID badge to the security for corrective action regarding the access.
- h) Participants should not leave their personal items of value unattended.
- i) Participants should aim to arrive at the guardhouse half an hour before the start of the meeting.

4. Registration

Registration will open at 08:30 on Tuesday, 1 September 2026, in front of the meeting room (LE1916). The way to the meeting room will be signposted from the building lobby.

5. Lunch and coffee breaks

Coffee breaks will be provided by the Secretariat, outside the meeting room.

Near Bonn Central Station. From Bonn Central Station you can either take the tram (line 16, 63 or 66) or the regional train to stop “UN Campus”. Please follow the instructions above under point 2.

Please note: The city of Bonn charges an overnight stay tax of 5% on the room accommodation rate from 1 July 2025 onwards, which needs to be paid by the guests at the hotel. This accommodation tax is not included in the hotel rates and needs to be paid additionally in the hotel.

7. Weather

The meeting is being held in early September, which is late summer in Bonn. The weather in Bonn will most likely be warm during the day but might get colder in the evenings. The average daytime temperature is about 15-20°C, and the average nighttime (or minimum) temperature is around 9 °C.

8. Currency

Germany's currency is the euro (€). Credit cards are accepted in hotels and in most restaurants, but not in every shop. Exchange rate on 28 May 2026: EUR 1 = SEK 10.81, PLN 4.23, GBP 0.87.

9. Voltage and type of pins

In Germany, the electrical plug/outlet and voltage operate on **220 volts, 50 Hz**, with round-prong European-style plugs that fit into recessed wall sockets/points. Many appliances with power adapters (such as laptop computers and digital cameras) can be plugged into either 110-120 volt or 220–240-volt sockets/points and adapt to the voltage automatically.
