MANAGING WORKLOAD AND EXPECTATIONS AROUND WORKING GROUPS

- 1. An indication of the necessity of ASCOBANS as a forum to address the conservation challenges facing small cetaceans in the Agreement area is that Parties have steadily increased the number of activities for the Secretariat to administer. While it is a core task of the Secretariat to facilitate the work of the different working groups (WGs), administer projects, and implement action points directed to it by the Advisory Committee, it is becoming increasingly challenging to do it all. The period between AC27 and AC28 has been particularly busy.
- 2. During this reporting period, the Secretariat organised three WG meetings and six workshops (in addition to preparing for AC28) see Table 1 below.

- 3. Part of the Secretariat role in organising and servicing these meetings is to plan, together with the Chair and/or WGs, develop agendas, provide report writing (which includes recruiting a rapporteur), arrange catering (when required), establish webpages (including registration), and arrange travel (when relevant). It is also worth noting that the timing of the workshops and services is sometimes driven by the immanent expiry of the funding provided.
- 4. The long-standing working groups at ASCOBANS are the Steering Groups for the harbour porpoise action plans: the Jastarnia Group and the North Sea Group. In addition, the Steering Group for the Species Action Plan for the North-East Atlantic Common Dolphin (Common Dolphin Group), though established only four years ago, is envisaged to continue as the other species action plan working groups. Other long-standing working groups are the Joint Bycatch, Joint Noise, Large Cetaceans, Extension Area, and Joint MSFD working groups. In addition, there are eleven intersessional working groups, established by MOP9 or subsequent AC meetings, and expected to complete their work at or before MOP10.
- 5. In total, there are currently twenty ASCOBANS working groups see Table 2 below. Each of the working groups require a different level of facilitation from the Secretariat, some working nearly independently, but most requiring the Secretariat to start and/or facilitate their discussions. In some cases, such as for the WGs for the species action plans, the Secretariat has been instructed to organize regular meetings via the ASCOBANS Work Plan 2021-2024 (ASCOBANS Res.9.1).

- 6. To reiterate, it is a core role of the Secretariat to organize meetings and workshops, facilitate the work of the working groups, and implement action points coming from the Advisory Committee meetings, and we remain happy to do our best. However, if the volume of tasks continues to be high, some other activities may not receive enough or indeed any attention. Arranging contracts for the Coordinators of the regional plans, maintaining the website, or finalizing meeting reports are other tasks that often get delayed for this reason, despite significant and regular overtime of staff.
- 7. The Secretariat recommends that Parties consider the number of new requests for workshops and working groups arising at this and future meetings. In some cases, it might be useful to indicate which activities should be given priority. In others, more consideration might be given to arrangements that allow intersessional working groups to operate more independently.
