stranded animals for the reporting period?




Figure 1: Pie chart of reported vessel strikes from necropsies of stranded animals per country

11.3. Does your country have a protocol in use to determine that a cause of death in postmortem examination is due to a vessel strike?




Figure 2: Pie chart showing if there is a protocol used to determine that a cause of death is due to vessel strike per country.

• **DE:** Regulate speed of motorboats inside National Parks. Letters were sent to operators informing them of measures and requirements in order to comply with the conservation laws

• **UK:** ORCA developed a "Ship strike training" programme.
